The quote, in context, was how he described the importance of being straight with people." He treated you as a friend from the first time you shook his hand and he looked you in the eye. Genuine, hardworking, caring and sometimes loud with laughter, Ed was there to listen first and then express all the reason why you are good at what you do. He made you a believer in yourself, a gift that if you knew Ed, you were privileged to receive from him.

Ty, on behalf of the IARA and the NAAA, it gives us great pleasure to honor Ed with this award. Ed's vision for all of us in this room was to be the best at whatever we do every day.

Therefore, it is only fitting that the Ed Bobit, Icon of the Automotive Industry award read: Icons of the automotive industry are legendary leaders who shape the industry and move it forward. Congratulations!
